#### **DESCRIPTION**

The aim of this module is to provide learners with the necessary knowledge and skills to identify indicators of trafficking in human beings, handle an encounter and respond to the needs of potential victims of trafficking in the asylum contexts, in view of safeguarding their rights in line with the CEAS.

This module equips learners with a comprehensive understanding of trafficking in human beings (THB) and its link to international protection. It introduces global and regional THB trends, legal frameworks, and the interplay between THB and asylum. Learners explore the definition of THB, including its core elements, and gain insight into complex issues such as consent and exploitation. The module also develops practical skills in identifying potential victims using indicators and handling encounters with care, focusing on communication and safeguards. Finally, it outlines the rights of potential victims and actions that should be taken to ensure their protection in asylum procedures.
